





Punctual:

- Confirm with the school in advance
- Be on time but be professional regardless
- Fully leverage Arbiter



Mindful of influence:

- "...participants in the educational development of high school students."
- Wrestlers, coaches, other officials & spectators take their cues from you

Aware of risks:

- Think safety during pre-meet duties
- Balance safety with the nature of our sport





Recognition of emergency conditions:

- Be proactive clarify roles with site administrators during pre-meet
- Primary focus on competition, but keep radar up for emergencies
