Section/ Page	What it says
Case 7.1.5G Page 45	Guillotine: Referee may notify when coming out of criteria.
1.7 Page 68	<ul> <li>In general, avoid talking to wrestlers.</li> <li>May promote activity via "center, action and contact".</li> <li>No coaching by referee.</li> <li>Direct comments toward both wrestlers.</li> </ul>
1.8 Page 69	<ul> <li>No communication between assistant referee and coaches.</li> <li>Only the referee should hear comments of the assistant.</li> </ul>
3.2 Page 75	Avoid miscommunication (e.g., verbalize choice of position as Top, Bottom, Neutral or Defer).

## Characteristics of Verbalizing vs Coaching

#### **Verbalizing**

Minimal
Essential
Neutral to competitive balance
Not expressly prohibited

#### Coaching

Touches on strategy or tactics
Superfluous
Impacts competitive balance
Unsupported by NFHS

# Guidelines for Verbalizing

- Know what NFHS promotes
- ➤ Inform wrestlers during pre-meet what to expect
- > Have a bias for saying less, not more
- ➤ Use the "Gray Area" in the best interests of the sport
- ➤ Get in the habit of using the subject "Wrestlers"
- Verbatim from the Rule Book tends to steer you clear from "coaching"

# Situations – Appropriate Verbalization or Not?

- 1. Action carries out of bounds for the 3<sup>rd</sup> time, with Red being the one backing out. "Red one more time and it's stalling."
- 2. Green has Red in a tight, but legal head and arm pinning combination. "Make sure he can breath Green."
- 3. Green is set in the defensive starting position. "Red, take your position. Knee...belly...elbow."
- 4. Green has a leg ride applied and is riding Red without turning him into near fall criteria. "Green, use it or lose it."
- 5. Action is heading toward the boundary line for the 3rd time. "Wrestlers, work in the 10 foot circle."

## Situations – Appropriate Verbalization or Not?

- 6. The wrestlers are on their feet, circling but not initiating a takedown. "Action!"
- 7. Red is riding Green near the boundary line. "Wrestlers make every effort to remain inbounds."
- 8. Green carelessly flails his elbows during a sit out and is penalized for unnecessary roughness. As you return to the center for the restart, "Green, watch those elbows!"
- 9. Red has Green in a guillotine in near fall criteria and legal headlock applied without the arm encircled. Green squirms so his shoulders are now slightly more than 45 degrees from the mat. "Red, he's not in criteria."
- 10.Green puts Red into near fall criteria. The official swings his arm in a visual count and says "Thousand-one, Thousand-two...."
- 11.Green has Red in near fall criteria using a cheap tilt. Red states "I can't breathe." The official, confused, inquires, "You can't see???"
